- 1. Comcast letter from May 21, 2018 regarding availability of EPiX HD beginning June 13th. Subscription fee will be \$5.99.
- 2. ComEd letter from April 19, 2018 commenting on their annual filing with the Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC). The filing included updated costs, supporting testimony and other information required by the "Energy Infrastructure Modernization Act" (EIMA).
- 3. Thorn Creek Basin Sanitary District sent notification of the increase in rates to help defray the cost of declining revenues from reduced per capita water usage. Their Board action was taken on Wednesday, May 16, 2018. Effective July 1, 2019, the base user charge rate will increase to \$1.436 per ccf or \$1.920 per 1000 gallons. This will result in an increase of approximately \$3.42 annually for an average user.
- 4. Notification was received by mail from the Environmental Information Logistics, LLC for a Notice of Application Permit to Manage Waste for the Beecher Landfill, 1055 W. Goodenow Road, Beecher. The purpose of the notice was informational only on the annual post-closure care cost estimate update in accordance with condition VI.6 of the permit.
- 5. Received a letter from Will County Center for Community Concerns requesting donation to help support residents in need. Board action may be taken.
- 6. Thank You note received from Audrey Gaines complimenting the Village on the Crete memorial Day Service and Parade.
- 7. Comcast letter from June 8, 2018 regarding additions and changes to the line-up in Crete.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Ordinance 2018- : An Ordinance authorizing the Execution of the Certain "Agreement between the Village of Crete, Illinois and the Metropolitan Alliance of Police Crete Police Chapter 36, 2017-2020". Board action is anticipated.
- 2. Discussion on a draft of an Ordinance Establishing a System for the Licensing of Organizations to operate Raffles within The Village of Crete. Board action may be taken.

3. Resolution 2018- : A Resolution authorizing the execution of an Intergovernmental Agreement to effect the Dissolution of the Eastern Will County Communication Center (EASTCOM). A change in law resulted in consolidation of PSAP's. Board action is anticipated.

- Discuss a request received from Joyce Woldemariam, owner of 3755 South State Street, on a proposed purchase of property located south of her property, which includes approximately two acres of land. Board action may be taken.
- 2. Letter of Engagement from Dan Berg of Sikich. The agreement is between the Village of Crete and Sikich LLC regarding the annual audit for the year ending April 30, 2018. Board action is anticipated.
- 3. Authorization to sign an Intergovernmental Agreement to form a cooperative venture for the joint and mutual operation of a centralized Public Safety Fire Communication System to be known as WILLCO FIRE RADIO GROUP. Board action is anticipated.
- 4. Discuss the proposal by Don Deel for the donation of 9 unimproved lots in Lincolnshire Estates Unit # 2. Board action may be taken.
- 5. Health Insurance Information Update from the Intergovernmental Personal Benefit Cooperative (IPBC) and the recommendation by EWBC, the Village's current sub pool, to join the sub pool of SWAHM to better distribute liability for participating members. Board action may be taken.
- 6. Discussion on the request from Republic Services to assess a monthly household fee to help absorb the increased costs for recycling incurred by Republic Services due to contaminated recyclable materials. Board action may be taken.
- 7. Ordinance No. 2018- : An Ordinance authorizing the execution of a contract amendment providing for and addendum and extension to the contract for service dated May 1, 2015 for paramedic/firefighter services between the Village of Crete and Kurtz Paramedic Service, Inc. The contract is dated May 1, 2015 and would extend to April 30, 2021 and would increase the number of personnel. Board action may be taken.
